In this season of Easter we often concentrate on the fact that Christ is Risen. But I remember the long hours studying Greek in seminary and how in translations by Dr. Peterson you would occasionally hear passages that contained the phrase, "*so that*." The phrase is most important for it speaks to the purpose or results of our actions and God's actions. Everything that God has done for you contains a "*so that*."

God created *so that* you would feel love. God walks with us *so that* we never feel alone. God guides us *so that* we do not have to worry about making all of lives decisions on our own. God sends Christ *so that* we can come to know God even in a closer, more intimate way. God gives us forgiveness *so that* we know that our growth is not the result of threats or coercion, but our growth comes from being completely loved. God gives us forgiveness, love, blessing upon blessing, mercy and grace *so that* we can give those same things to everyone around us and everyone we meet.

Oh yes, it does sound somewhat idealistic. Especially due to our own experiences in life. But just imagine what our days would look like if we placed the so that's into motion. But I guarantee you that it not only would change the world, but it DOES change the world. If for no other reason than it changes the way you see the world. It changes the way you respond to the world. And you begin to see the world and the things around you through the eyes of Christ. You begin to see the world and all of creation as God did in the beginning and God declared that it is GOOD. It still is good for God is still here with us. Perhaps the greatest gift is the invitation to walk in the WAY of Christ. God sends reminders to us constantly.

One reminder comes to you each and every day. You already experienced it this morning. For if you are reading this it is because you woke from sleep. Each morning you rise and that reminds us that Christ rose from the dead. Death was defeated. Not only spiritual death, but death from being captive to ourselves. We have the gift to focus upon our love for others. In doing so we live a life similar to our creator who focuses upon all of us and all things. It sounds like a lot to accomplish, but surprisingly, it is very freeing to know that we, everyone and everything is in the hands of God. We love and trust God, *so that* we no longer have a reason to worry.
