


Go in Peace. Serve the Lord. I imagine these imperative statements are very familiar to all of us as we hear them every Sunday. And sometimes, the things that we say repeatedly become somewhat rote. Yet, the reason for the repetition is in the hope that the things that we proclaim in faith change and form us into the way of Christ.

You will notice I used the word **"into"** rather than in the way of Christ. There is a reason that I do so. In the scriptures, in the original Greek, we find this phrase, *pistou eis Christou*. Eis means into rather than in and that is significant. For anyone can believe in something or someone. But to believe into someone speaks of action, formation occurring as we walk more like our Lord daily. This relates to my first sentences written here. Go in peace. Serve the Lord.

The Christian doctrine of the Trinity is the central doctrine concerning the nature of God in most Christian churches, which defines one God existing in three coequal, coeternal, consubstantial divine persons. God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.

Though the Trinity is mainly a Christian concept, <u>Judaism</u> has had parallel views, especially among writings from the <u>kabbalah</u> tradition.

a peaceful presence in the world. Surely our world is filled with more than enough strife and Christ knows this. But you are sent into your lives to show that there is another way to live. You do it by keeping and remaining at peace.

Often when I teach about this I will reference the wedding service from the seventeenth century Book of Common Prayer from the church of England. This is the service that begins with the familiar phrase, "Dearly beloved, we are gathered here today..." In this service, those in attendance are asked if there is any reason known that this man and woman should not be wed to speak now, or forever hold your peace. In this example, holding our peace means to remain silent, to hold our comments to ourselves. In other words, it speaks of behavior.

To serve the Lord in our lives is often associated with things we DO in service, and I have found this congregation to be amazing in this way. People are blessed and fed in this place. Lives are changed and people are healed from addiction. Just to mention a couple of the many things that happen within these walls. One of the things that I teach is that there is something that is equally, if not more important in service. That is BEING.

To carry peace in our hearts begins with the proclamation of peace to us in a way similar to the peace that was declared on a night so long ago by angels to the shepherds in the fields. But to experience the peace that Christ brings requires that we live into that peace. There is that word again, "into."

Perhaps the greatest form of service that we accomplish in the name of the Lord is to follow the teachings of Christ. I have often thought it would be a wonderful study to go through a synopsis of the four gospels from beginning to end and to list the teachings of Christ. For Christ told his apostles to go into all the world making disciples. Baptizing them in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. And teaching them to obey my commandments. Those commandments are Jesus' teachings.

When we do just that, follow Jesus' teachings, something remarkable begins to happen to our lives and to us. When we do unto others as we would have them do unto us. When we forgive as we are forgiven. When we love our enemies and pray for those who would wish to do us harm. When we guard the words of our mouths as James taught us that our tongues are small flames that can burn down an entire forest, we are following Christ.

And the amazing thing that happens? Peace! Peace within us. And that peace doesn't only remain within us, but it flows to others that we encounter.

So, I ask that you ponder these things in your hearts. And the next time we hear "Go in peace, serve the Lord," may we do it in thought, word, and deed with the help of the Holy Spirit that abides within us all.
