

When I was called by the Spirit to this place, one thing that was mentioned was having ideas for ministry. And while I definitely do have ideas, those ideas are only useful if the community here wishes to participate in those ideas as ministry. I could endeavor to create many programs or types of ministries, but they are only useful when things are fulfilled.

Furthermore, if the pastor does all these things, then the pastor is approaching our Lord and asking what path we should take. Then he listens for the will of God and discerns what God would want for us. This sounds wonderful initially. But in doing so, the pastor also takes away the opportunity for the people of God to pray and discern the will of God for the community's ministry.

An excellent example of this is the possibility of some sort of Sunday School program. Rather than simply saying one is needed, I asked for those who are interested in this to enter conversation and discernment of what that might look like here. There was a response to this, and a process is developing to explore what that could look like, for the Lord has blessed us with many families with children.

No doubt, you remember Sunday School from your lifetime and the instruction you received about Jesus. I would hope that we certainly want to have that opportunity for these little ones that we love. But it is not only about them. Groups have formed already for women and the men that could accommodate more people should they be led to attend.

Finally, a pastor never comes to a congregation with intentions of changing ministry for the sake of change alone. Instead, we review what God is doing through you now. We look at the community and the possibilities for service. Then we ask you, God's people, what are the next things, the next steps, the next ministry that Christ wishes to see here. Then we discern together.

The ministries that are happening now should all continue, for God is accomplishing amazing things in and through you. It will not be long till God's Work, Our Hand's Sunday is here. In so many congregations I have seen, this has been a focus for outreach into the community. But I am thankful to say that here at Good Shepherd. That does not take place only for one Sunday a year, but it happens every day.

If you have ideas for ministry, we can share them and discuss where God is calling us. Some have already been shared with me and further discernment will happen concerning those ideas for ministry.

So, thank you for the way you follow Christ and for the way you show your neighbor Christ's love.


Our latest financial snapshot for the month of July 2023 is shown below.


