and friends. I hope that when you think of these things that you also think of your congregational family that loves you.

I often think of vacations and holidays during this time of year when we take time to leave or "vacate" our normal surroundings to journey to a place where the normal obligations of life are far behind us. This, in and of itself, serves to renew us as we rest and realize there are times when we can just be still. These are special times where we can sit with our thoughts and reflect upon our lives and the many blessings that we have. Years ago, a member of a parish shared a story with me about going hunting. It was something he had done since he was a young boy and he always looked forward to this time of being out in God's creation. This was such a big event in Pennsylvania, where he lived, that even schools and some businesses closed on the first day of hunting season.

He shared that he was out in nature where he had a tree stand and once he had climbed into that place, there was nothing more to do than to wait. Hours would sometime pass while he sat there waiting for deer to approach. But this was an unusual time that he spoke of. For on this day his mind was captive to the God who created all that he was seeing. While thinking of this, he was suddenly aware of God there in that place. His heart quickened pace, his hair stood on end, how could he have never noticed God in such a real way before? As he spoke, tears began to roll across his cheeks. I told him that it sounded as if he had experienced Holy Ground.

As he continued to reflect upon this holy moment, he shared how he wished he could return to that place in the hope that it could happen again. For he was so swept away by the presence of God that he had lost all recollection of what he was doing or why he was there. He told me that many deer along with several bucks had appeared and he had no interest in killing them. Smiling he said, "I just let them live."

I thanked him for being willing to share such a sacred story with me, but asked what he thought God wanted to share with him? If there was nothing more than that incredible feeling of the Lord's presence, then that was truly a gift. But I challenged him by saying there was more.

We all have "Holy Ground" moments at some point in our lives. They are times and places that we never forget. But the additional gift in this is when we learn to take that Holy Ground with us, wherever we may go and throughout each day. Then we learn to exist and walk in the presence of God always.

In relation to this time of year, we find that there isn't only one time for renewal, but that we are always renewed by God's presence with us. I invite you to think of this, to carry God with you throughout your life. Learn to live in a constant state of renewal, a life of grace and peace.


