

It is hard to believe in many ways, but the season of Lent is upon us. As we travel this path together, I continually ask what will be the thing that we take away from this journey? What will we have learned? For surely there is no occurrence or circumstance that God cannot use to teach us something.

This brings up an important point. In our journey with God, we are not called to remain where we are in our faith, but we are challenged to grow. This season of "wandering in the wilderness" calls us to "wonder" through the wilderness of our own souls. This process is not one that seems to be extremely popular, even among Christians, for it requires that we honestly and objectively examine our lives of faith. ### Ash Wednesday A Day of Ashes and Fasting



Wednesday, February 14 Worship Services at 12 Noon and 7 :00 pm

February 14 begins the season of Lent this year. Traditionally known as Ash Wednesday, we mark this day with a somber call to selfexamination and repentance, or "turning back to God." In addition to two opportunities to worship, we ask everyone to consider joining us in a **Day of Fasting**, upon medical approval.

Fasting is an act of worship that helps us to focus on the truth: despite all that we stuff into our lives, it is God, and God alone, who truly gives us life and sustains us. You are invited to enter into this truth by <u>fasting from a meal or two</u>, breaking your fast with Holy Communion. If you are unable to go without food for medical reasons, you may choose to simply restrict what you eat. Afterwards, consider making a special donation to our **Food Pantry** as an offering of thankfulness for God's gifts to you, and in recognition of the millions in our world whose hunger is never really satisfied.

"Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you? – unless indeed you fail to meet the test! (ESV)

While studying yesterday I came across a quote from a native of an area where I formerly served, "No one else can live the life you live. And even though no human being is perfect, we always have the chance to bring what's unique about us to live in a redeeming way." – Fred Rogers

Living in a redeeming way calls us to live as one redeemed by the grace of God through Jesus Christ. This means that we must do more than confess Jesus as Lord, but we are called to have lives that reflect that truth in thought, word, and deed. This is something, as Fred reminds us, that no one can do in your place. Your neighbor cannot be a Christian in your place. Your pastor cannot be a Christian in your place. Your church cannot be a Christian in your place. It is your journey and your responsibility alone and it is a journey that we answer to God about.

This time of Lent reminds us of the time spent in the Judean wilderness by Christ. God calls us to the wilderness where the distractions of this life are rare, where there is nothing left but you and God. God becomes your focus and only care. It is here that you can be tested and examined, asking God where do we fail and what is the next step in our faith?

How does one begin to do this? One way is to focus upon the teachings of the Lord. Christ sent his disciples into the world telling them to make disciples, students, of all peoples, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Teaching them to obey my commandments. And yet, how is that done if we do not know the teachings of Christ?

This Lent we will give you an opportunity to hear the teachings of Christ and to ask yourself, "Do I heed? Do I follow? Do I Obey?" During my time as a pastor, I have heard several times that people do not like to be told what to do and yet, if Jesus is our Lord and Master, that is exactly what Christ does. He didn't ask the disciples, "Will you follow?" No, he said, "Follow me." That is an imperative, a command and the result of following Christ is abundant and eternal life, both now and in the world to come.

Ask whether not only your actions, but your thoughts adhere to the teachings of Christ? Are they of your desire or God's desire? Do they align with the world or with the will of God? If not, there is work to do, for the journey is not over.
