meaningful change in your life and the way you live. For living into the good news frees us from what we once were and how we once saw the world. It calls for us to see the world with different eyes. The eyes of Christ!

Jesus came not only to rise, but to raise the bar, to set the goal higher than just lip service. He came SO THAT! So that we might have life, and to use his words, that we might have life abundantly. Does that mean abundant things? It depends upon what you are speaking about. If you are asking about things where thieves break in and destroy, or things that rust and decay, then the answer is no. But if you are speaking of things that remain, things that reflect the love of Christ, such as abundant love, abundant mercy, abundant, forgiveness, abundant joy, then yes, this is the abundant life that Jesus speaks of. In fact, life that does not contain these things is not life at all. This is why Jesus spoke of some who were "alive" actually being dead. And not only dead, but if not believing into him, being condemned already.

If you thought, the pastor made a grammatical error then I will explain. In the Greek language of the original scripture, it speaks of not believing in Christ, but believing into Christ. To believe into something calls us to become like Jesus, to live like Jesus, to think like Jesus. The good news is that you do not have to do this alone. You do not have to depend upon your own ability or strength, for Christ is with you.

So, I invite you, I challenge you to live a life that does not look like SO WHAT! Instead live a life SO THAT!
