I was praying this morning for the world, for those who are afraid, for those who are sick, and for those who have died. After-


wards, while being filled with the presence of the Lord, my mind was upon you. I was wondering when you pray, how do you pray, and what do you pray for?

The Feast of Pentecost May 19, 2024



Pentecost is a Christian holiday which takes place on the 50th day after Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Mary, mother of Jesus and the Apostles of Jesus while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles

In the first chapter of Acts, Jesus alludes to sending the Holy Spirit onto his disciples:

While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the holy Spirit." (Acts 1:4-5)

her heart. I asked her what she missed the most and will never forget her response.

Every night before they would go to sleep, they would hold hands while facing each other. Looking into one another's eyes they would say the Lord's prayer. 
