Yet the Spirit guided me to something that Christ desires from all of us and that is having the heart of a disciple.

Some of you have already become accustomed to searching the scriptures and the internet with your questions pertaining to faith. Being there are so many varied teachings and interpretations in the world, you will come to me for clarity of what the Church's position is pertaining to your questions.

Let me say that this is truly a gift to the Church and to me personally, for it shows your desire to not only be assured of your salvation in Christ, but to know all that you can about Jesus and the Lord, your God. This is what I mean when I speak of having the heart of a disciple.

Jesus told his apostles to go into all the world, making disciples of all peoples, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. And teaching them to obey my commandments. In this "Great Commission" the word disciple means students.

The fact that the Lord desires us to be students leads to the reality that faith is not a place where we arrive in our knowledge of God, but rather a journey where we depend upon the Holy Spirit who teaches us all things pertaining to God to lead and guide us in that journey. What a blessed and exciting journey it is!

Recently, one of the questions that I had received from a member revealed the answer to a question that I had pondered for several years. The question was relating to the Bible and Scripture.

I found it interesting that when Jesus would quote what we know as Scripture, that he would not use that word, but say, "It is written." And in the original Greek, where modern translators place the word scripture into Jesus' conversation, it actually says writings. This is because that was originally the meaning of scripture, it was something that had been written by a scribe.

The words that we use from day to day in every language throughout the world have a history. They have a time when they were first used and recorded. The same is true of Hebrew, Greek, and the Bible itself.

In researching the question posed, I found that Saint John Chrysostom who lived from 386-388 first used the words "ta biblia" in a homily. Ta biblia means "the books." And this is from the Greek Biblion. This is where the our word Bible comes from. Yet at this time it was not called Holy. I had looked for years for any evidence as to when that began by searching for when was the Bible first called Holy. But in my research for a member here I found where the word scripture was first referred to as Holy, sacra sciptura. This happened in the Middle ages. So, there is the answer that I had been looking for.

Why is this significant? The reason is this. Jesus told his disciples that the Holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name will teach you all things and shall remind you of all things that I said to you.

In the Middle Ages, the Holy Spirit revealed to humanity that the scripture was sacred or Holy. The Spirit was and is teaching, just as Jesus said.

That same Spirit teaches still to this day and the ones who are being taught are each and every one of us. I am so honored to walk this path of discipleship with all of you and I pray that this path continues to be one of great blessings as you learn more about your faith and your God.
