congregations work together, rise to challenges, walk with God through those challenges, and through all of this, the congregation remains. But are we called to do more than just remain? What does it mean to thrive as a Christian?

So much of thriving has to do with how we face the things that come, how we face adversity, and how we rise above those things praising God through it all. In light of the reality of our differing views, I sometimes wonder if it would be a total waste of time to be upset or even disappointed if things should not go the way we desire. For even if we made the choice to be upset, and that is certainly a choice when we are, what would it have changed? Would anything be accomplished by being upset? The answer is simply, NO IT WOULD NOT. Circumstances will not change. People would not have changed their decisions. The world will still continue in its course. The only thing that would be different is that our blood pressure would have possibly been elevated. Then she asked what about the people who would blame her. Well, first of all, Christians should never be about blaming anyone, we should be about forgiving. For the scriptures often teach that if we do not forgive, we shall not be forgiven.

THINK ABOUT THAT! If that doesn't get your attention, I don't know what will. I find it actually somewhat frightening. So much so, that I often pray to God to give me a forgiving heart. Lord, let me forgive before any offense occurs or before any offense is taken. That should be our prayer, but more than a prayer. It should be our way of life.

WHAT WONDROUS LOVE

One of the hymns the choir will share with the congregation during lent is *Wondrous Love*.

Originating in the 1800's the hymn was first, only the text, which was common for that time period.

Congregations would choose secular songs of the day that were familiar to many and add sacred words.

Although the text was published in 1811, it was not added to the melody that we now know, (an English ballad) until 1840 in a collection of hymns in shape notes called *Southern Harmony*.

In an effort to assist people in learning to see notes and learn the melody, each note was given a shape to indicate pitch: rectangle, oval, diamond, cup, shield, right triangle and upward triangle.
