God's peace, Pastor Faron

If someone were to ask you what the three expressions of the church were, what would your answer be? Many times, when I pose this, people will look at me somewhat bewildered. But it is a good and appropriate subject for this moment, for as you are reading this the churchwide assembly of the ELCA is taking place in Phoenix.

The three expressions of the church have to do with the polity or organization of the church. Historically, there are many approaches to polity and through those approaches we become familiar with words like Bishop, Presbyter, etc. Some of these approaches bear more or less authority within the church depending upon the denomination. For example, our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters have what is called a magisterium. This is the teaching authority of the church and states that it is the church that interprets scripture.

Indeed, if you look at the first pages of a Catholic Bible you will find the imprimatur. This gives the printer permission to print the Bible.

Our church polity still vests authority within the congregations. And this is why your pastors are not assigned or appointed by a central authority. We trust our congregations, the people of God, to pray, to search the Lord's will for their congregation as led by the Holy Spirit, and to follow the Lord's will. This is not only the way that the pastor is called but is necessary to be called by a congregation before a pastor is ordained by a Bishop. So, the congregation is the first of the three expressions.

The second expression is the Synod. And a synod will have a constitution in the same way that a congregation does along with a Bishop and their support staff. Some synods are larger, like here in Virginia, with several members of staff to assist the congregations in the mission and ministry of the church. While smaller synods may have only the Bishop and one assistant.

The final expression of the church is the Churchwide body consisting of the presiding Bishop and support staff that works in conjunction with the Lutheran World Federation and the Conference of Bishops. I have also had members of congregations that served on the Churchwide council, which is similar to a congregational council, but represents the national body of the church.

I ask that you keep those meeting to conduct the business of the church to remain focused upon God in their decisions and deliberations. Especially, as our presiding bishop, Elizabeth Eaton, will be leaving and they will be calling another bishop to lead the ELCA.

We sometimes speak in an almost casual way about our prayer life. But our prayers are heard by God and are truly important. As we pray, we pray for guidance not that our will be done, but that God's will be done, so that all may know Jesus Christ and his forgiveness.

Johann Sabastian Bach 1685-1750



J.S. Bach was a German composer of the late Baroque period and wrote music for the principal Lutheran churches in Leipzig. He was prolific and wrote for orchestra, keyboard, organ and voices and adopted Lutheran hymns in his four-part chorales, sacred songs and vocal works. He was a devout Christian and has been referred to as the "the fifth evangelist" composing over 300 cantatas on gospel readings and large works for orchestra and choir, including the most famous B minor Mass and St. Matthew and St. John Passion. I have decided to devote the five Sundays in August to playing music of Bach for the prelude and postlude to pay homage to his incredible talent and love for God.
